Yet guardyoureyes has a video on their website www.guardureyes.com/GUE/Tips/SealofTruth.asp

I know of a teenager who almost committed suicide after seeing that video on jewishsexiality.com, and that video can cause much more damage than that above post ever could (just ask any mental health professional, no matter how frum)

And the truth of this video is based solely on the testimony of one person, and it is therefore impossible to verify, unlike manuscripts that is difficult yet possible.

NB kedusha writes " a number of things she is quoted as saying seem very far from a Torah Hashkafa and seem to distort Halacha as well. For example, whitewashing the issur of holding

hands with a niddah; suggesting that Penuyos go the Mikvah to minimize the issur, which the Poskim have dealt with and forbidden."

This is complety false, in fact the Dr says just the opposite, I fail to understand how a guardyoureyes admin can publicly accuse someone based on what someone wrote on a blog (I maybe wrong kedusha but did you read this on "the moderate voice" blog?)

Her is what the Dr writes "none have put this opinion into writing; and while some individuals may practice this, it is certainly not a mainstream approach.
