I was just curious. did you go through the steps? With a sponsor? Do you understand what the steps are all about?

I did. And I still am. And the way I see it is simply this: If I myself, little old me, went through all of the Mussar Seforim that I could find, and tried all sorts of various methods of self improvement from different sources in Chazal, and after years and years I found that a particular Derech in Mussar, and working through it in a particular way, helped me to improve in the particular area where I was lacking, would I need a Haskama for that? Would somebody tell me that even though I was using tried and true methods of Chazal, since I am using them in an order never before used it is not Yashrus and Krum - even though it worked for me and made me a better Yid?

I think that is crazy!!

And so if you yourself admit that individually the steps all have sources in the Torah, and all that's bothering you is the "source for the source of it all", why is that any different than my scenario? I don't feel a source is necessary for a tried and true method of recovery that is based in chazal.

As far the addiction being a sickness, how about looking in Hilchos Avoda Zara? Bowing to idols and trusting in them sounds even crazier than what we do by objectifying women!!! And if someone was stuck in an Avoda Zara craze, wouldn't you recommend that he work to "Give

himself over to G-d and pray to him that he help him overcome his defects"?

If you haven't worked the program yet - and "The Program" is the steps and not the fellowship - I strongly recommend that you do, with a sponsor who has worked them himself. Once you do, all of your questions will be answered by themselves. Try it!! I did and it is changing my life!!

I know Reb Yid you always told me to stop thinking so much, but I couldn't. That's not to say that I was against the 12 steps or any of the major issues that were brought up. I accepted the fact that I needed help and I was willing to do whatever it took to get better. In the end, with guidance from certain GYE experts, I decided that the steps were not necessary for me. There are people like that here on the forum. It was also made clear that what works for 12 steppers is not necessarily healthy for the others.

I dont know where mixedup is holding, but keep in mind that he may need a different approach than you.

Having said that, there is still something about figuring out how this shtims with chazal that intrigues me. It's not stopping me from doing what needs to be done, but it still bothers me. It's not so much that Im not interested in going against chazal, but i cant believe that chazal would leave us without proper protection against this malady. Thus the argument about why didnt we werent concerned about chazal before acting out is missing the point.

Now maybe I'm wrong and mixedup is not at all thinking like i was. But I think the thread that i mentioned does a good job of really dealing with the issues. Reb Yid, you will remember that you had a phenomenal piece there, that Ive gone back to many times.

and finally I will remind the chevra of something that was said many times in that thread. Remember that some people are coming from a whole different perspective and it takes time to get used to thinking this way. Have some rachmunus!

mixedup, I hope youre not. Regardless of whether this clarifies anything or not, you must jump in and do whatever it takes to get better! Let the philosophy work itself out as your getting better. Don't let it stop you from progressing.
