Rather, we pray for them to be granted all the things Hashem wants us to care about people for (mefarnesin, melavin, vekovrim akum k'yisroel - Gm Gittin): food, shelter, real love and healthy relationships and all good, including health and even a good death (Gm' Brachos).

And anyhow, do you really think these pretty secretaries, nurses, and shoppers who dress pritzusdik do it because deep down inside they are tying to attract guys to desire them and get sex?! Not so. What do you think will happen if we'd smile at one of them and try patting her on the behind or propositioning her? She will slap you or me in the face and call the police! Quickly indeed will her dignity be clear...more dignity than I ever had in my acting out, to be sure.

Rather, they are just doing what they learn...as you and I are just doing what we learn - we see porn and pretty women and want to see more of them and sneak it. We discover that masturbating ourselves leads to orgasm and we want to have it again and do so, even though it is a sin - cuz we have learned that there is nothing else like it. We just do what we learn, too.
