Dear levbasar,

Welcome to our community! Once you've arrived, there's no turning back. Everyone here will just grab a hold of you and pull you up, up, up!

Rabbi Nachman said "There's absolutely no such thing in the world as giving up". There is always hope, even from what seems to be the deepest depths of sin and despair. And he also said: "**If you believe you can destroy, believe you can fix**". You obviously believe you can destroy, no? That is clear from your post... So, admit that you can FIX.
