For me, lust (or "shmutz") is a disease based on selfish attitudes and outlooks. The world revolves around me, myself and I. At times when I was driven to some degree of introspection and I felt bad about my life situation, I would attempt to convince myself that I should stop because this behavior was "immoral" and lowly. That usually helped for about 5 minutes.

One of the "paradoxes" of my recovery from selfishness, is that it was driven by selfishness.

It couldn't have happened any other way, because I was selfish, through and through! As sad as this sounds, I could not muster enough "Yiras Shamayim", love, or any other altruistic motivator to help me stop. I stopped because I had suffered enough pain and I wanted out.
