He was quite clear in stating that if the emission caused no distress or discomfort there would be no requirement to immediately wash ones hands before continuing to eat.
Its a halachic question thats mainly theoretical for a few of the reasons i stated above mainly from personal feelings i would have to change from discomfort which would then trigger me needing to wash regardless
