For right now- I'm not talking about internet- although that is definitely where this Nisayon could get much worse- I have had dips-but I have a strong filter on my computer- and usually keep myself away from unlimited alone time on others computers.

But i'm talking in real life- looking into windows- hoping to get a glance of something, worse yet when things get worse getting an idea in my head of potential peeping spot- and parking my car in that spot. Climbing roofs, trees, peeping though key holes- when I have an attractive guests.. setting up mirrors so that i have a possibility of seeing into somewhere- again I don't want to go into details and cause others out there Hirhurim. Thoughts developing about how to get access to places by planting hidden videos.

I haven't worked through the handbook methodically- which i will get on it.

The problem is I can go for months with out acting out- and then it will hit me hard- a new idea that I NEED to implement.

But almost daily- I have to keep myself from looking out of my window- trying to catch a glance at neighbors- even if it's only a glance. Finding myself keeping track of neighbors schedules...

How do uproot this from my being? If anyone would know this awful part of me...

How do I track this on the chart? What does clean mean(assuming that the mzl is under control?)

In your case, I would suggest making your own set of rules for yourself that would be your "bottom-line" behavior or "red-lines" ... and I would use the 90-Day journey to chart your staying clean from those behaviors. I also suggest that you consider therapy.

Check out this thread of another guy who seemed to have exactly your issues.

A quote from his thread:

I'd like to share one final thing that I saw today that impacted me (and I am trying to dwell on it more and really have it sink in.)

PORTLAND, Maine – A Maine man caught peering up at a girl from below an outhouse toilet seat four years ago stands accused of crawling into another pit toilet on White Mountain National Forest property in New Hampshire. A federal affidavit indicates a 49-year-old man confessed to repeating his previous act on Memorial Day.

Federal agents sought the man out after a 9-year-old boy saw him climbing out of a toilet at the

Hastings Campground. Two witnesses saw him walk away from the outhouse.

Forest Service special agent William Fors wrote that the man initially said he climbed into the waste-filled pit to retrieve a T-shirt. Four years ago, he said he was retrieving his wedding ring. Fors wrote that the man eventually confessed climbing into outhouse pits on more than two occasions.
