And together, we hold hands and soar. Now, how can we offer that to the people that for some reason or other cannot come here regularly?

There are those, probably precious few, (besides for Muttel's talmidim, that is). So, there was a thought of some of the people here together creating an anonymous hotline. A place where people can call to speak to someone that has been in a similar place, a place where a person can get a mentor that really understands him, and can offer him real help. Of course there are many details to work out, like who are the mentors? How are relationships monitored and run a way that will only be helpful? And many more. We would probably have to set up an operating system where people are connected only to mentors not in their hometown, etc.

The hotline could also be a resource for rebbeim etc. looking for tips on how to help their talmidim

Now, before you go, I want to share something. I had discussed this idea with one of the special guys here on Erev Shabbos. And I wondered how such a thing would look. Just a few days later

I got to try out in real time, and it is currently working wonders. There is a wonderful person here who has been doing his own work of spreading awareness of what GYE has to offer. He's been doing so in BMG. And got over 20 calls from people wanting to know more. A few days ago a guy called, but this was someone who our tzaddik was uncomfortable speaking to. He asked me if I could call this yungerman back. Which I did. I got to know a really special yungerman, a real ben Torah, who's been struggling for years all alone. Has hardly heard about GYE, and had no idea what it's like. And he has no regular access to internet. He still has enough to struggle with, unfortunately. And I have had the zechus of guiding him, of showing him how he can get past all these behaviors. He's BH on fire and I daven he'll keep soaring. My friends, Hashem gave me taste of what it would be like to help people that don't know the culture here, that haven't read any threads, that don't know about the F2F program, and most importantly, that don't know there is a way out.

And we can change that.

I took a day or two to mull over the unbelievable conversations and accomplishments happening on this thread.

Yasher Koach R' Eerie for being the **fire**, the **heart** and the **blood pressure** behind this powerful conversation!! You are a gift to us and to Klal Yisroel.

Although I am late to the party, I would like to weigh in with some thoughts. And some take-away from this conversation, Halacha Limaasah. Hope yall don't mind a drop of length here.

Point 1.

My thinking is there doesn't have to be a **single** proposal or plan of action as a take away . **Everyone must and can make a difference in the way that he knows how.**

Seems like pretty much everyone agrees that we want to try to reach the many people out there struggling who think they are the only lonely terribly twisted frum guy.

We want them to discover (GYE) the power of a community and the help they can get.

Each of us has ways to reach out. Not everyone has the capability to do or even should do what IWLR is doing. Or man a hotline. Or speak to a prominent Rav or Adam Gadol. Or talk to his talmidim or Rabbeim. But look what just a few guys have already accomplished!

The main question, I think, is for each of us to ask ourselves is "WHAT CAN I DO". There is an answer that each one of us can learn.

Point 2.

Reaching the leaders. It has been surprising to many that some of the special people in Klal Yisroel's leadership, who are sought after by many in crisis, don't know what we do about how to help the many that (ought) to turn to them for help. Well, Chazal say ??? ??? ???? ?????? , and for better or worse, that's **us**.

So we need to share our experiences with them, so they can learn how better to help others. I think that's a goal in and of itself. Each of us may have someone we are close to, who could benefit from us going out of our comfort zone and sharing some of what we know. This is an independent proposal and a critical one.

Point 3.

Reaching the masses.

I think that the aforementioned leaders, (if they truly are such) will have opinions and ideas about how to reach people within their communities. A hotline might be the greatest method for one group, while targeted advertising for GYE might be a better method for a different group. Retraining Chosson Madrichim and Mashgichim might be a third Mehalach... Change takes different forms when it's awareness ...
