There are many bachurim, or even yungerleit, who struggle, and they don't have regular access to internet. Maybe they struggle with masturbation, or phone lines, or other unhealthy behaviors. And they also need help.

) that have a rebbe that they can talk to. Among the yungerleit it's even less common. They are uncomfortable, and understandably so. Then, there are many rebbeim that are doing a wonderful job at helping their talmidim. And there are talmidim that wish they had such a rebbe.

Another point

One of the most powerful things in this place is the fact that we all in the same boat, we all understand each other's struggles because we readily admit that we have been there ourselves. And together, we hold hands and soar. Now, how can we offer that to the people that for some reason or other cannot come here regularly?

There are those, probably precious few, (besides for Muttel's talmidim, that is So, there was a thought of some of the people here together creating an anonymous hotline. A place where people can call to speak to someone that has been in a similar place, a place where a person can get a mentor that really understands him, and can offer him real help. Of course there are many details to work out, like who are the mentors? How are relationships monitored and run a way that will only be helpful? And many more. We would probably have to set up an operating system where people are connected only to mentors not in their hometown, etc.

The hotline could also be a resource for rebbeim etc. looking for tips on how to help their talmidim

Now, before you go, I want to share something. I had discussed this idea with one of the special guys here on Erev Shabbos. And I wondered how such a thing would look. Just a few days later

I got to try out in real time, and it is currently working wonders. There is a wonderful person here who has been doing his own work of spreading awareness of what GYE has to offer. He's been doing so in BMG. And got over 20 calls from people wanting to know more. A few days ago a guy called, but this was someone who our tzaddik was uncomfortable speaking to. He asked me if I could call this yungerman back. Which I did. I got to know a really special yungerman, a real ben Torah, who's been struggling for years all alone. Has hardly heard about GYE, and had no idea what it's like. And he has no regular access to internet. He still has enough to struggle with, unfortunately. And I have had the zechus of guiding him, of showing him how he can get past all these behaviors. He's BH on fire and I daven he'll keep soaring. My friends, Hashem gave me taste of what it would be like to help people that don't know the culture here, that haven't read any threads, that don't know about the F2F program, and most importantly, that don't know there is a way out.

And we can change that.

So someone in the Mir could duplicate this. And each individual could perhaps duplicate it in their shul (if they're comfortable). But it requires individuals duplicating it in their community, and not there are very few IWLR's out there willing to do that. You can hang up signs like this in Burma, but I ain't hanging up signs like this in the local shuls.

But I do hear that it's a lot more repeatable than I thought at first.

I don't want to be the negative nancy (discouraging david? shooting down shem?) on this thread so let me be a little more positive. Go for it! We can do it! Rah!

A couple relevant things from my experience in EY -

there is an organization that puts up stickers all over with phone numbers to call for help with shmiras habris.. and people try to rip them down or rip out the numbers. I spoke to a mechanech/father and he said that the "organization" is not ok. They tell ppl to give thousands of shekel to tzedaka or whatever. Not sure, but my point is - when it is a personal letter from someone at YOUR yeshiva, it says I learn here in BMG etc. it sounds much better than from an anonymous organization of no repute. So not so easy just to put these signs all over, needs to be thought out carefully.

There is an organization that has the backing of all the gedolim called Lev Shomea. They are a hotline and bachurim, avreichim, rebbeim, roshei yeshiva, fathers can call in to get advice, reassurance, guidance etc. They asked a lot of Roshei Yeshiva about speaking out about these inyanim to the bachurim, and about dealing with bachurim who reach out to them. The general consensus is: we don't talk about such things, they should call Lev Shomea (the number is \*8147)

So making a hotline should be awesome! It would need to be something that people feel is ok hashkafically and comfortable to talk to, and consider that there is a wide swath of people dealing with this challenge...

Let's create change!

GYE sent us a flyer a short while ago when they started their advertising campaign and told us that we can hang it up in our shul if we want. We can ask GYE whether they still agree to this. I would only say to do so in a shul or kollel where the rav doesn't mind the sign or at least that you know that he won't be upset at you for hanging it up.

I am not for an anonymous person hanging up a sign that he is offering anonymous help. Although you know that you are safe, someone reading the sign, including myself, would assume that it is an unqualified person trying to offer advice, and would take the sign down. BMG or the people in BMG were right for taking down the signs, regardless of their general policy of whether this topic should be written openly to the public.

GYE has a teens division and even if a teen sees the sign he is safe. If GYE were concerned about exposing every teen to a sign of GYE I don't think they would be advertising everywhere. I don't think it would be proper to hang up a sign in a Mesivta. The magidei shiur and staff should be educated about GYE teens, and send someone there if he deems it appropriate.

1) Definitely, the plan would be for it to be clear that anyone calling would be speaking to a likeminded ben Torah who has been through similar struggles. When I spoke to the people you sent my way that was the first 10 minutes; I shared my story and what GYE (read, HHM and the GYE chevra) have done for me. Then we get down to business

2) It would definitely have to be under the constant guidance of HHM, with even the guys here

as I pointed out, this had been done. The ma'ale here of having people that have been there, that have helped others here or in their yeshiva, it just cannot be overstated. I think there are more than 3 people that are able to help the average struggling guy. And we could create a system to ensure that people are not biting off more than they can chew.

4) I don't think this is any way limited to BMG. Ads in shuls, periodicals, etc. could be put anywhere, and I would hope for at least one thing. That the people reading them know that they are not alone and there's a way out

Reb IWLR, I'd point out one thing about your gevaldige sign that has possibly bothered the chassid sh\*te

You wrote in the sign that many bnei Torah are struggling.

Now, of course, it's the plain and simple truth. But that guy either was very offended, or struggles himself.
