Stressing that **any** unfiltered device in the house is a michshal and strongly encouraging the parents to make the house technology-safe. Everyone knows that they need to be doing this anyway, but getting such a warning that their Talmid chacham son is coming home for a month, can serve as an extra impetus to actually do it and be extra sensitive for the time he's home.

It sounds so pashut, but only because on GYE we have the vantage point of seeing how much damage this is causing. Any thoughts on the matter? Are Yeshivos already doing this? If not, how would we go about creating awareness among Yeshiva leaders?

Thank you Tzadikvkam for bringing this thread back to life. I already forgot about it. I tend to be that guy who comes up with ideas to improve the world but never does anything about them.

I think this idea of sending letter home to the parents before bein hazmanim can make a big difference but I don't know where to start. What do people think about publishing a generic, fictitious letter in one of the Jewish magazines, saying Dear Tatti and Mommy...signed your precious son learning in Yeshiva...? In other words a letter that everyone's son could and should write to their parents but we write it for them. Would something like that cost money? Does anyone have an idea who to speak to at Ami/ Mishpacha. Is this the best way to reach the Jewish world these days?

No question that Bein hazmanim is necessary for a ben torah but also no doubt that there is

very little guidance as to how to do it right. I believe the Roshei Yeshivos know that the bachurim fall during bein hazmanim, but not sure if they know to what extent... I think the best solution would be to create a bein hazmanim structure for boys, ideally something in person, or at least some sort of curriculum that they can do virtually that keeps them engaged in things, both in learning and otherwise but most importantly something they're busy with and make them feel accomplished....sorry I'm brainstorming again, hoping that someone will take an idea and run with it.

I think that an unfiltered device and the problem of falling during bein hazmanim are two separate issues. An unfiltered device is just as much a problem when a young bochur is home from yeshiva for the weekend or when he sleeps at home all the time as it is bein hazmanim. Bein hazmanim is a problem even without computers. As a bochur in Yeshiva Gedolah away from home my problems were only during bein hazmanim, this was before the internet and it was even when I wasn't exposed to sexually charged material. Not having a regular schedule and that nobody saw what I did were the only culprits. Computers are usually addressed during school registration. Unfortunately, there are parents who don't follow the rules and harm their children. If a bochur is able to tell his parents about the problem he is having then that would be the best solution. There were other suggestions in the past of how to handle such a situation but I don't remember the name of the thread.

I assume that yeshivas nowadays give some advice to bochurim before bein hazmanim and I am sure that there is a listening ear in every yeshiva for a bochur who wants to discuss his bein hazmanim struggles. There is usually very little that a parent can do for a bochur who isn't having a structured day during bein hazmanim but some parents are better equipped to help their children with struggles in kedusha than others. The bochur should speak to a parent or to someone from the yeshiva staff or with someone on GYE that he feels would be the right person who can help.

In my personal opinion, letters from the yeshiva/magazines sent out in a general way have little to no impact. If bochrin really want to make a difference at home, they have to approach their

parents themselves.

Anyone who doesn't already have a filter won't be convinced by articles and ads. Even if it talks about how they're destroying their kids/bochrim, they're already convinced that "he's better than that".

A more practical approach as I see it would be to get the rebbeim in yeshivas to push bochrim to do this.

Any rebbi that's already dealing with these things and knows of a bochur who has unfiltered access anyways would be pushing the bochur to take care of it. (I know of such a maaseh with someone I know).

Therefore, I'm not sure where such a campaign would be directed at. Rebbeim and yeshivos that aren't dealing with these inyanim at all?
