I had an idea that I think would benefit alot of people here. I was thinking of starting a new accountability group like the ones we have on GYE but with a couple of different twists.

1) Everyone must check in every other day. Failure to do so without good reason would lead to expulsion from the group. I know this seems harsh but if you look at all these groups, they end up dying iff because people dont check in. I would only want people in this group who are as committed as I am if not more.

2) It would be independent of GYE. This is done to gain more privacy and allow people to be more open and also shows how committed you have to be to the group in order to stay in. It will be private so nobody can read it without granted access by the moderator.

I think this can be a great tool for people who are really committed. This will not be a 12 step group or anything like it.

Hey, instead of ignoring me cuz you think you know how predictable I am, I want to tell you that I really think this idea of yours is awesome.

As you can guess, I feel it is reinventing the wheel. I am part of a group of men who want to stay clean and meet on the phone to talk and do some work for that prize. We talk about being

honest, we discover new ways we were always lying to ourselves, and we learn what real commitment means. It is the third cycle of this group - it always starts with about 10 guys and ends up as about 5. Those who stay are definitely committed and undergo change that usually stays with them.

Then the unthinkable 'happens' to most of them: they decide to *meet* some other guys in the group ***in person***. And as intentions and decisions are meaningless and empty unless put into real action, they do meet them.

As each of those guys will tell you (and you know at least five of them by username), meeting other guys in the group who they are working together with, is a life-changer. And the changes last. The single most predictable factor in growing up (and out of this schmutz) is the demand for saving face. We all like to call it 'privacy'.

That's why I *love* your idea. It is a step towards having a more realistic relationship with the other guys. And the best part of all is that it is *separate from GYE*. It's your own, so it's more personal. Geshmak.

I am committed to my sobriety and recovery and would agree to join with you and be on your call. I have only one condition and make one promise:

The only **condition** is that no *usernames* are allowed - we'd all use our real first names. Enough fakery and hiding behind play-names. If that condition is OK

The **promise** is that I will not spew any program stuff in the context of that group. I know I am just another sex addict who desperately need to hang onto the sobriety he has been granted by Hashem today. The group will obviously be a mix os addicts and no-addicts - but that has nothing to do with membership. We all want to stop sex with ourselves and the porn and fantasy junk that goes with it, right?

...it seems to this bozo (me) that you are re-frying the same old beans, friend.

Will you now be more cognizant, somehow? Have you been the sudden yoreish of some new trove of wisdom and insight?

AA discovered that self-knowledge was **not** the answer. What have you discovered and how is

it really any different?

There is 'going it alone', and there is 'going it alone'. I do not believe that "getting closer to Hashem" is the answer - until you have payed the price and learned how to *first* get close to other sick people - people like you.

Being 'spiritual' is easy, when it's just you and G-d. Then when people get involved we really start to learn that our 'relationship' with Hashem wasn't *nearly* as real as we thought it was. That is a gift of meetings, and davka in person.

Thanks to Hashem I can go to them, and do, regularly.
