You can even call into an SA meeting. I find meetings to be the best way to squash the Yetzer Harrah. The Denver chapter of SA has phone meetings almost around the clock. Just go to www.denversa.org for the schedule. Not to brag at all, but I call people, go to meetings, and have a sponsor who I call every day, all in order that I don't isolate. Keep up the good work, you are doing awesome, you almost made it to 90 days! Very inspiring!
