I think because most people feel that if they are that serious enough about the program that a call to a sponsor will help there are other more conventional methods not to fall that don't involve chillul shabbos, such as calling in "five minutes." We can all keep sober for at least five minutes, and take five minutes at a time until Shabbos is over. In other words, I think most people feel there is no true situation where the "only" thing that will help is a call.

I agree with both Dov and Silentbattle.

Regarding what Dov wrote: Indeed, only an addict in recovery can truly appreciate that this is indeed an issue of Pikuach Nefashos (even if that were not the case, as previously indicated, it need not be Pikuach Nefashos in order to allow a Shvus d'Shvus; this is a Halacha Mefureshes, and the Adam Gadol did not dispute that the Geder is whether the person is a Choleh she'ein bo sakana). And any addict who has not yet begun recovery (for argument's sake, let's say that means he has less than 90 days) will probably vote "no," because, frankly, he fell last week on a Tuesday, without calling anyone, so why should he, all of a sudden, be making calls on Shabbos?

Regarding what Silentbattle wrote: Yes, if recovery is worth making a call on Shabbos, then it's certainly worth making a call during the week! Even knowing that I would potentially make the call on Shabbos should make me realize how important it is to make the call during the week.
