See Medrash Tanchuma in parshas Vayeishev, on the passuk **וְהָיָה כִּי יִשְׁתַּחֲוֶה אִישׁ לְאִשְׁתּוֹ כַּאֲשֶׁר יִשְׁתַּחֲוֶה אִישׁ לְאֱלֹהֵי**At the end of the piece the Medrash it says:

וְהָיָה כִּי יִשְׁתַּחֲוֶה אִישׁ לְאִשְׁתּוֹ כַּאֲשֶׁר יִשְׁתַּחֲוֶה אִישׁ לְאֱלֹהֵי

The meforshim on the side explain that if not for the words of Hashem to chava **וְהָיָה כִּי יִשְׁתַּחֲוֶה אִישׁ לְאִשְׁתּוֹ**, the women would have the power to seduce men at will. I'm taking out of this medrash that Hashem stopped them from having the power over men to just force them into the act in the middle of the street. But they still have an awesome power over us. And if we stand together, and stand strong, how great is that! And when we have those burning desires, and we only wish if only...know that that's the story of being alive! That's the way Hashem created us. It's up to us to control how we act, and together we will prevail
