Even if you know with certainty that you haven't fulfilled your obligation in some area because there were so many obstacles, don't let that get you down. Consider that the Creator, blessed be He, examines all hearts. He knows that you wanted to do things as best as possible, just that you were not able. And then strengthen yourself in joy in the Creator, may He be blessed."
