One of my Rebbeim said, when we started learning Maseches Nedarim/Shevuos, that saying a Shevua B'Sheim is like comparing your word to Hashem's existence- that what you are saying is AS TRUE as Hashem. Meaning, no half-truths, misrepresenting or stretching, and of course no white lies, because Hashem is as true as truth gets.

It's a serious thing to say about a statement, which is why many people are scared to say any shevua at all.

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
