It only takes a second to hit "minimize" once I hear footsteps coming. (I work in a cubicle.) I run to the bathroom to "relieve" my taivos. Last month, I was successful at staying clean the day my wife went to the mikva, but I have to make sure I have enough work to do to stay busy!

I probably cannot install a filter on my work computer, or ask my boss if its OK to install one. I have K9 filter and screenshot-based monitoring at home. The work computer is monitored by

the company, but I hope and pray that they don't check their logs unless they have a reason to suspect you. Of course I hope even more that any dirt they have on me is, in a few months from now, going to be a few months old, and a few years from now, a few years old.
