Then when time for shema came I was so ready to say it with all my might! Then by Hashem's gift the surf was up! And not only that, the waves were even good at the part of the beach where I wouldn't see any indecent things. As I was talking with some of the non Jewish surfers out in the lineup, I noticed a change in myself, that I have some self confidence now. Thank G-d.

The truth is, I'd rather surf Hashem's waves, that took years to make just for me to surf, than be trapped in this addiction. I'd rather use the legs He gave me to run a million marathons than give into lust. I'd rather use my eyes to learn Torah than see anything that will challenge me, but I know it will happen and when it does I have faith the G-d will help me through it.
