It's good to see others struggling with the same issues as me, and also to see others succeeding. Only others who suffer the same thing can appreciate how hard it is.

My important question right now is: I have the k9 filter installed on my computer. The password is totally hidden from me and I don't have access to it. But the software is registered to an email address that I have access to. I could put in a dummy email, but I'm just worried in case one day I actually will need to change a setting, and for whatever reason I can't get the password, and then I'll be stuck.

So, I thought maybe there was an email address here that was kept for this purpose? And if ever I need to get the new temporary password (99.9% probability will never need to) then I can chase up the email address owners. Does anyone know?
