Many people have posted that they cannot or are not ready to go to SA meetings because their wives do not know about their addiction issues and they are not ready to involve their wives, so they can't just "disappear" to SA Meetings without explanation.

[I am not about to discuss the pros and cons, and the when and when-nots of sharing addiction issues with one's wife, there has already been much said and written on that, but I want to address the above problem for those who have not (yet) included their wives.]

I would like to suggest that a person with the problem of not being able to explain his absence while attending SA meetings might look back at the time when he had no problem "explaining" to his wife all the time spent on watching pornography, or chatting online, or "staying late at work" (while being involved in whatever his lust/sexual addiction entailed), and maybe for some people here - explaining expensive internationally billed phone calls (to sex related phone numbers), or unusual credit card charges (for lust related spending), etc. etc.

For these things the Yetzer Hora made the person into a "Genius of Explanations".

Also, how he managed to live "a double life" without involving his wife in "his other life".

So maybe one can utilize that experience to figure out ways to deal with the "explanation" issue, or the "double life" issue while in the process of recovery, and if attending SA meetings is what is necessary for his recovery, then he should not allow this to stop him, at least until he is ready to share with her.
