But that lack of authenticity may have left me feeling like I left a lot out of my sharing and disclosures. It did seem that most sex addicts, at least in SA, had some form of same sex experience, however minimal. But I chose to not divulge that part of me.

Openness and honesty are the linchpins of recovery.		
SA is a closed environment where everyone is a sex addict. They are non-judegemental. If you can't admit it there, where can you?
