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Yeah, I agree Newaction. I sometimes think that the Wall of Honor is a replacement addiction for me, but it's healthy (if that makes any sense). It's good, I guess, as long as it doesn't represent the entire focus of your recovery process. That is, as long as you don't lose sight of the forest from the trees, and not let a WoH reset (I know -- they're horrible) totally take you off the derech, using that tool "religiously" is good.

During my absence from the forums, updating the WoH, even on a daily (okay, multiple times, daily) basis was the only form of participation on GYE for me. It kept me tethered to the community, and was a tangible way of cauterizing that gangrenous, putrid act from my *newly born* path to sobriety. In another words, marking in a fall is kind of a way of telling yourself: "It happened; I'm done; I'm moving on!"

To me the cumulative count is more important than the current streak because it represents the totality of all our efforts regardless of how many times we may have fallen and gotten up again.
