I downloaded a few dating apps and I started to get involved with girls weekly and having sexual contact. I still maintained my virginity although risking it on countless occasions. Came Elul and I wanted to change again so I got an old iPhone with limited access to these apps. I was clean until Pesach. When I came back to Israel, I was raging again with temptation. I had a new iPhone and got involved in the apps again. I started seeing women and last week I got an apartment and I invited a girl over. That night I lost my virginity to much regret. The next morning the girl left and I invited another girl because I seemingly felt I already did the worst so I might as well just go all the way now. We slept together all morning and parted ways. On the way back to yeshiva I felt that my life is just hopeless, there's nothing to be done anymore about it. I just will simply give into this temptation and let it be because I tried before and it failed numerious times. I met the girl again a few days later and we did it in a bathroom. I just felt deeply engrossed in my desires to even put a second thought as to what I'm doing right now. Above that, I got back into porn to fulfill my desires when I'm not sleeping with women. At this point, as I'm still engrossed in my desires, I just feel there's no hope and I'll just continue this destructive behavior.
