I'm sorry but I didn't understand this paragraph. When you say you're familiar with the browser option of removing all images, are you referring specifically to Hidelmages or to the general concept? Which brings me to the next part which is even less clear: what do you mean it makes looking up a simple thing tedious or near impossible? I have no problems whatsoever with Hidelmages. It's an excellent extension with a button that sits in the toolbar. It doesn't hide images unless I click the button and if I decide I want to see the images after I already clicked the button, I just refresh the page. So unless you're someone who needs to find images of specific people for some reason, I can't see where this extension would cause you any problems.

Finally, your last sentence "I'm also not the only user of pc, and cannot do this to the others." is completely beyond me. I'm sorry I'm not understanding, if you could clarify I'd be glad to respond.

In the meantime, I'll see if I can find anything that removes only the pics of a specific gender or quality.
