If the only avenue for constructive criticism to directly email [eyes.guard@gmail.com](mailto:eyes.guard@gmail.com), then this immensely important and most worthy site will miss out on the opportunity for public discussion on initial suggestions and comments -- which can often lead to a collective "refinement" of these ideas, in the "open source" and "crowdsourcing" traditions. It might even attract tech-savvy members with programming skills to volunteer their time and energy towards advancing the various technologies used by GYE (not only the website, but also the mobile app, and possibly other areas).

To give a sense of how this might look, I present two examples:
