I think that another very important goal that this wonderful website can enhance is the appreciation of marital intimacy -in both the emotional and physical realms. Obviously, the "hook up" culture and the easily accessible garbage on the net present a world which is completely devoid of marital and emotional intimacy and which promote a world where anyone can engage in, view and read about any kind of conduct described in the Krias HaTorah for Mincha on YK, which is completely at variance with how a Ben or Bas Torah Torah is supposed to act at in any society at any time.

Yet, if we look at Chazal and the Rishonim, we will see a very different view. The Talmud in Brachos tells us that one of the Amoraim hid under his rebbe's bed while the rebbe was engaged in marital relations, and told his rebbe upon being discovered that the conduct that his rebbe was engaged in was a mitzvah. Many of the Rishonim, especially Igeres HaKodesh of the Baalei HaNefesh, attributed either to Ramban or Raavad (which I recall being sold in the Catskills with a marker that it was only to be sold to married men!), rejected the twin extremes of the hedonism that was the hallmark of the Greco Roman world that Chazal clearly were aware of and critiqued, and the puritanism of Christianity. A prominent rav and psychologist once described the Igreres HaKodesh as a manual for physical intimacy between husband and wife.

I would agree that certain passages in the Mishneh Torah, the end of Volume 2 of the Mishneh Brurah (which one of today's Gdolim was reserved for the use of Tzadikim) and the KSA (which was frightening when I first read it in English) present an almost puritanical perspective on these issues.

I am sure that many of us know that the equivalent of a certain women's clothing exists in one of New York's most prominent Torah communities, and that advertising for the same (without pictures of course) can be found in Charedi media.

There is no doubt that those of us in that parsha must observe all of the details of Hilcos Nidah, have a proper sense of Shermiras Einayim, Tznius and Kedoshim Tihiyu in our lives. Yet, if we realize that physical intimacy with our wives is a wonderful Mitzvah that all of us can only enhance by working on our SA, our addiction can be cured.

Why did I write all of the above? Perhaps, we have mistakenly accepted the view that marital intimacy is an averah, as opposed to a mitzvah, and have focussed excessively on repressing the mitzvah between husband and wife, which, in turn, caused many of us, including myself, to seek other vastly inappropriate outlets that have led us to SA.
