Things got heated again this week in Beit Shemesh, so while being *maavir sedrah*, this thought crossed my mind^{[it's a bit Rabbi S.R. Hirsch style, so I checked in his Chumash, and while he does say something similar, he doesn't say this [i]mamash[/i]. So being that it was his *yahrtzeit* this week, I'm dedicating this piece *lezichro*].}

Just before *sheini*, the *pesukim* discuss the way Moshe comes before Pharoh and requests permission for Naareinu, Zkeineinu, Baneinu and Bnoseinu to leave. Pharoh refuses saying, "Hah! You don't need them. You only need the men, *Ki oisah avodah atem mevakshim*. You don't need your daughters; you just wanna have one o' them Black-Hats-Only assemblies!"

But this secular, non-Jewish viewpoint is totally wrong! They think Judaism is all about sticking stubbornly to a few dry rituals- kinda like church, sit, here, stiffly, now stand, stiffly, now sit, silently, turn the page now, dumbly, murmur weird Latin words, idiotically.
