Some answers:

- 1.) Hilchos Hamantashen are a very complex and intricate topic only an experienced posek in these haloches should decide. Beavonoseinu horabim many Jews are nichshal in the issure Hamantashen and they do not realize it. Even more those who serve the Hamantashen can be over many issurim.
- 2.) But one may be somech on the opinion of those who allow the consumption of a lot of poppy as it is done for a mitzva. And the nations know that it is Purim vekayyma lan bepurim somchim alhanes. But only if it is done leshem shomaim otherwise he is only filling his stomach, harei ze megune.

There are also those who would not eat a Hamantash without a reliable mesoroh.

4.) If he is shikkur and therefore does not know the difference between boruch Morchdechai and orur Homon then he fulfilled his obligation. If it is caused by the consumption of poppy it requires further study whether one could rely on the opinions that even drugs may be used to fulfill the obligation. 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I'm pretty sure that the *poskim* say that the *lashon "I'vsumei*" was meant to include other substances that are *m'shakker* even if there are not ingested by swallowing. So in the case of poppy where the *davar hameshakker* IS swallowed, you will be *yotzeh I'chol hadeios*

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
