Good morning. I knw this isn't a very heilige teshuva kind of thought for the morning of erev RH, but in my own recovery this is where I'm holding and tryong to improve. BH with His help I am w/out mast* for abt 150 days. However, P* is still drawing me A LOT. I realized thius morning why.

When I act out by m*, I feel horrible. I hate myself and eventually w/in a day or so, I lose my temper on those that I love and they suffer for my problem. I in turn feel guilty and suffer from feeling bad abt the acting out, and feeling like a piece of dirt for hurting my loving innocent family.

That has helped motivate me to stop as strange as it sounds.

Now, here's the kicker- while I feel bad abt p*, I don't lose my self worth to the same degree that I do whem I actually m*. I don't feel so bad abt myself and so sad that I lose my temper in frustration. It bugs me and I go vaiter. So I'm lacking the same motivation (emotional pain) that I

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have to quit m*. ... The place where this really hurts me is when together w/ my wife and trying to say s/t like 'I love you'. I feel like a total hypocrite then... But its still not really motivating me enough to quit p*.

This is coming up now bc, I really would like to stand in the yom hadin and feel I have a plan to live p* free as I know Hashem wants. I simply can't just tell myself 'its assur' 'your gonna go to gehenim' That has never worked for me. I still act out and just feel dammed.
