That is my only true commitment, for which I would lie, deceive, manipulate, throw a fit over, neglect responsibility, assign blame.

By then, I have already instinctively made the first step: I acknowledged my problem for what it is, admitted that I am powerless to stop it, and wrote to my Rebbe begging for help. I may have davened that day for Siyata d'Shmaya, too: because while browsing some Israeli website, I saw a GYE banner.

Ninety one days later, I am, by the Grace of G-d, ninety days clean from intentional watching of pornography and masturbation.

Thank you! Thank you to Mordechai, who pledged \$90 to GYE if I stay clean for 90 days. Thanks to our newest moderator, UAJ, for a consistent flow of good ideas.

Thanks to all the new guys (can you even see me, I'm so high up in the clouds?) for letting me rant and vent on your threads.

Originally, I was going to wait till the end of ninety days and refer back to the handbook, and to the "GYE in the Nutshell" for whether I need additional help. Thank G-d I realize now I will always need additional help.

CRITERIA FOR PORNOGRAPHY ADDICTION

- Recurrent failure to resist impulses to view pornography
- More extensive/longer viewing of pornography than intended
- Ongoing, but unsuccessful, efforts to stop, reduce, or control behavior

• Inordinate amount of time spent obtaining pornography, viewing pornography, and/or being sexual—either through masturbation, or with another person or object, or recovering from sexual experiences

• Feeling preoccupied with fantasy, sexualized thoughts, and/or preparatory activities

• Viewing pornography takes significant time away from obligations: occupational, academic, domestic, or social

Continuation of behavior despite consequences

• Tolerance—more frequent or intense pornography is needed over time to obtain the desired result

• Deliberately limiting social, occupational, or recreational activities in order to keep time open for finding and viewing pornography

• Distress, restlessness, or irritability if unable to view pornography (withdrawal)

a. dizziness

b. body aches

- c. headaches
- d. sleeplessness

e. restlessness

f. anxiety

g. mood swings

h. depression

The criteria listed above are the most common signs to look for in assessing a pornography addiction. If pornography addiction behaviors parallel sexual addiction, then a minimum of three

of the above ten are needed for a pornography addiction to be considered present. Dr. Carnes has found that most sex addicts have five signs, while over 50 percent have seven.2

I can't resist re-posting this one. Just this morning I was thinking (as my wife is out town) that I am so cured, that a little porn can't harm me. Or actually, it doesn't need to be porn. I can just let my eyes wonder in the street a little. After all, I'm not doing anything...

So if I score 10 out of 10 on this one, and over 15 out of 20 on the sex-addiction test, and 19 out of 27 on some other devious sexual behavior test, I should probably concede I have a bit of a problem. And yet, every so often I get an idea in my head that my problems are exaggerated and I just need to relax and not worry about guarding my thoughts, eyes, and hands.

How kind is my G=d, that He continuously reminds me that He is my only hope. It's so easy to slip into thinking that "elilim" will save me.
