What would I say if I had the opportunity to speak at the kinus for women being advertised this week...

I cannot speak for a womens perspective but as a husband/son/father here are some of my thoughts.

Your sons are growing up in a world with unprecedented challenges. Most of your children will be exposed to things that used to be beyond comprehension. That is even if you are successful in keeping your house pure. Please know that your children especially your sons will be

challenged. There are things you can do to help them get through these challenges.

1. love them unconditionally. No matter what. Especially when they are struggling they need to know that you still love them.
2. Believe in them. When a child feels that you believe in them, that empowers them to stand up to challenges. Always praise their strengths.
3. Never judge. It's easy to draw lines that should not be crossed. Don't judge even if those lines are crossed. You have no way of knowing the nisayon of the next person- even your children. The best advice is not to judge anyone and to leave that for hashem.
4. Talk to them. Keep the lines of communication open. If they trust you and are used to communicating with you, you will have many more opportunities to help them if they are overwhelmed by challenges.
5. Simcha - happiness in the home is key. Do whatever it takes to make your home a happy place. Focus on all the positive aspects. The Simcha of Shabbos and yomtov (not the stress of cleaning up etc...)
6. There is a natural curiosity to look at things that should No be looked at. This is true for your daughters as well. Even the really "good" ones. Don't make it easy for them to satisfy that curiosity. Filter and password protect everything.
7. No filter is going to stop someone who does not want to be stopped. The main focus must be on the internal person. To help them build the connections and the desire to be connected to hashem.
8. The desire to be close to hashem needs to be stronger then the desire of the temptations around them. Otherwise eventually the willpower to resist can easily fall away. Try to bring an awareness to that connection which is unique for each individual person.
9. Your children must know that hashem loves them no matter what. So many years have been lost by people that fell and didn't bother getting up because they did not believe that hashem still wanted them. (It's not all or nothing)
10. Teach your children to recognize the positive that they do. The yetzer hara will tell them that they are a rasha for a few big aveiros when in reality they are holding back from aveira much more then they are giving in. We can reinforce this concept and protect them from falling for that trap of the yetzer hara.
11. We are not perfect. Hashem created us and created our challenges. Good people fall. Sincere people fall. Talmidei chachamim fall. Don't think that once someone falls that they are "damaged goods". If someone falls you can still believe in them. Believe in them and you will help them to believe in themselves.
12. These challenges are opportunities for growth. With the proper perspective you can help someone ordinary become extraordinary in their relationship with hashem.
13. Share these concepts with the people around you. Discuss them. Make them part of the fabric of your house.

I believe that with this atmosphere we will be able to raise a generation of ovdei hashem who will rise from the decadence around them to levels of yira and ahavas hashem that are unfathomable.
