The frum word's response to the internet was slow and rocky. The response to the problems caused by the internet was slower and rockier. Bachurim always had teenage drives (see the teshuva from the chasam sofer(?) about the yeshiva bachur who had an affair with the wife of the family hosting him) but it's gone from having to put in effort to get erotic content to having to put in effort to avoid it. And of course that's had an effect on the whole avir in the yeshivos.

GYE has an [article from 2011](#) about meeting with Torah Umesorah. I wonder what came of that.

Don't want to keep on beating the dead horse about awareness, but specifically when it comes to bachurim, probably in the last 25 years the numbers of bachurim who have seen erotic imagery of some flavor went from low to the vast majority. I don't want to make a wild guess about the intensity of bachurim's struggle with masturbation, but it probably went up along with that. Not porn addicts - normal bochurim dealing with normal bochur tayvos. And it seems like yeshivos for a long time were stuck in a mindset from a previous generation (where porn was something unusual) that is misaligned with the problem.

It's a delicate issue. I suspect it doesn't help much to say porn is filth and shouldn't be discussed if most bochurim already have been exposed. And overcorrecting and saying porn is normal will just ensure all bochurim are exposed. And there's so much shame, guilt, teenage hormones, and delicate personal issues that it's hard to deal with even one on one. And many rabbeim either never struggled or still struggle and either way can't relate in a helpful way. So it's rough.

That being said, I think preventative awareness is probably the biggest place the frum community is making progress in this area. It's now normal in many institutions to require parents to have a filter, it's becoming more normal to have a preventative "talk" with younger boys (From Boys To Men would not have been published 25 yrs ago probably), and yeshivas are wrapping around to being able to say that the problem is not just "movies" or "internet", its "porn". Of course there's more to do. But this is where there's progress.

Less progress seems to be being made for people currently struggling. Just my thoughts with no real experience or proof.

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Sefer HaTanya begins with the Rebbe saying that it should be something that one learns from their Rebbe. But there are too many talmidim to know each one as well as he should, and the problem is only getting worse, so he writes the sefer to "take his place" because that is at least better than nothing for the masses.

How many people today have a Rebbe, one that they are close to for years and is close like a father, their guiding light and inspiration, their understanding and loving confidant? Probably rare and much less than it should be. Most school systems today don't support this relationship. Every year is a new Rebbe, and our mechanechim are busy. Much effort needs to be put in to



interject yourself into their busy schedule. Everyone is so busy.

It's not just these issues that a Rebbi could help with, it's with life in general. What is valuable and meaningful? What is a real Ben Torah life? What is shalom bayis and intimacy really supposed to be?

Steep cliffs and slippery slopes abound, but we have few anchors. We're storming the beach at Normandy and hey, at least some people seem to make it through more or less alive. We need to stop playing the numbers game if there's any hope to save the majority. The losses we suffer are too great when we just keep throwing everyone through the system and hoping for the best. We're killing them. Why do we do it? Because we don't know what else to do. We're too scared to face the reality of how far off course we ended up.

I'm a nobody who really knows nothing about anything, though it seems to me that if you project our current path, the system as a whole is not sustainable. We need trailblazers to keep pushing these small victories of change. We need leaders to keep acknowledging and supporting what it takes to be a healthy Torah yid in today's world - and in general.

Sorry not sorry for the depressing outlook, but (yes, I'm going to quote the Lorax) **"Unless someone like you cares a whole awful lot, nothing is going to get better.It's not."**

Answers I do not have. But care? We can all care. If we care enough, we can at least try to make things better.

I'm no big deyah zoger but in my experience in yeshiva this topic used to be totally taboo but recently it's been a little more spoken about but definitely not in detail. When I told a rebbi that I had a problem I was looking up pictures on a flip phone almost every day constantly making hachlatas to stop and it never worked...

and I was hoping to open up and figure out what's wrong with me and how to fix it. he told me it's a problem that a lot of bucherim have and he's very impressed with my courage to call him etc. and for practical steps he said to get rid of the phone and get one with a filter.

I was pretty upset cuz he kinda brushed it off saying get a new phone it'll be ok. I knew in my

heart I get a new phone but I was thinking I will stil be wanting and waiting for the moments that I have an unfiltered device. (Which whenever I had access I would fall even though each time I made hachlatas to not do it again...)

I'm not saying we shouldn't tell bucherim that a lot of bucherim have this problem so don't feel guilty etc.. but I feel like a solution or a proper way to deal with the issue isn't offered. If a bucher in yeshiva had an issue of having really smelly feet would the rebbi tell him to get new socks and move on or would he say go figure out what's wrong get some spray and fix it. I was thinking about this truly excellent suggestion over shabbos. It doesn't have to be limited to dropping off a physical copy of the book. I think it would be very powerful if a Rav/Rabbi/Rebbe got a personal email from a shul member/talmid explaining his story, giving over the shameful pain of suffering in silence, and explaining how GYE helps (and perhaps linking to some of the educational material on the site and/or the TBOTG ebook).

I think it could even be done anonymously. If you're careful to leave out the precise identifying

details of your story, you can send it from a disposable email address. Even done anonymously, as eerie pointed out in a different thread, the personal nature of the email would no doubt have an effect.

Just a thought. It's a small thing, but very easy to do, and who knows what effect it could have.

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
