This morning, I got urges again but reminded myself that I'm better than that.

The tricky part is I'm at a very secular, hedonistic school. Everyone is having sex, and it's tough not to think about it. The Jewish community here is tiny. Most Jews are Reform and have no interest in Chabad due to its conservative and "restrictive" ideas.

If I do get married, how do I finance it? I'm supposed to make money, and I probably wouldn't be able to have kids until after college. Plus, where would we live?

I think this habit comes from a yearning for someone else. I love kids and would love to have my own someday. But hey, I'm figuring it out.

A lot of important and deep questions you're raising. I bolded one line that I found very inspirational, thank you.

I'm just going to push back and clarify the quoted part above. Orthodox guys don't get married young because they need an outlet and God would prefer you have sex with your wife instead

of with your hand. That's a very destructive thought.

Orthodox guys (and gals) get married young because Judaism teaches that a man and his wife are two halves of a whole. Marriage is a precious completion of two incomplete people. We get married young because we don't want to be unmarried any longer than we have to.

Loving sex in a marriage is a completion of that unification, and a completely different world than sex with your hand. (That's not to say "outlet" style sex can't and doesn't happen. But that's not the point of marriage by any means.)

The actual realization of this ideal involves a whole lot of hard work.
