Thanks for sharing this. I'd add to your great points that a) The easiest time to be in control is before the nisayon. Once you start lusting, self-control becomes orders of magnitude harder. b) If it seems daunting, take it in steps. Kind of like starting a seder for the first five minutes b'retzifus. "I'll keep eyes on the sidewalk for the first block, first two blocks etc." Next thing you know, you're at Shul. c) I find that on top of the practical, immediate benefits of having avoided looking/lusting at passersby for x amount of time, it gives a real boost to my sense of control in general, meaning I'm taking positive offensive actions against the YH and **succeeding**, which trickles over to other areas, like when I'm online etc. Oh yeah and you might have a funny story or two, <u>I know I have</u>..
