When I start a day like that, I usually feel stressed out for a while after since there was not attacking you AT. I merely did not know why you were hesitant. Just curious thats all is a general feeling of not being in control. When I get overwhelmed with life, I think about how tenuous our lives really are, and our sanity, and how miraculous it is that for most of us, most of the time, Hashem gives us things that we can handle. The world is so big that if we start letting

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in a little more than usual of it into our consciousness, it is overwhelming, and if we block out too much, it is boring.
