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I have a friend from shul. Late 20's. A tyereh Yid. New family. I give him a ride home from his workplace sometimes. We talk. He came to the USA from Hungary, married and settled in St. Louis where they opened a file with Immigration to process his becoming a legal resident on his path to citizenship. Then the immigration agent became somehow convinced that theirs was a sham marriage just to get him legal. Wedding certificates, affidavit from the Rav, wedding albums, their baby--The agent's still suspicious.

Fast forward, they move to the west coast, and do the drills to have the case sent here. They're told by their immigration attorney that it looks like things have moved forward and that they should get approval in 4-6 weeks.

Yesterday morning, 6am he's in the shower and 6 INS agents push into their apartment take him from the shower, tell him to dress, and take him to jail. they won't let him bring tallis, tephilin, siddur, nothing.



Fortuantely the Chabad rav network went to work on the situation and were successful in getting him siddur, talis, tephilin and kosher food. He can't get a bail hearing until Monday. The rebbitzen did some homework and found out that while he's in jail, it's not a bad facility, and he's been given his own cell. B'H

My nephew who is a well known immigration attorney, says he's in trouble if the judge wakes up with a crick in his neck. He could be looking at rapid deportation.
