I'm fairly new to GYE, but am already a big fan... want give ya a big shout out

Also - although I didn't read every one of your posts in this thread - the one where you made a distinction between the "pure lust addicts" and the OCD-people really caught my attention.

I never acted out live or pursued online relationships, all my acting out has been completely

personal (perhaps with the one exception of asking my wife to do some things that she wasn't 100% cool with - but frankly fairly minor stuff in the overall spectrum... err I digress..) And I FOR SURE have many of the OCD compulsive symptoms that you speak of.

While I've had the problem for over 20 years - I'm fairly new to this angle of it, so I certainly don't profess to have a formed opinion on it. But I have been getting some help from Dov in getting a perspective on my problem (on my WOH thread) ... and so far I'm thinking that I am primarily a LUST ADDICT (with OCD baggage). To put it a different way.... perhaps at least in some cases the root of lust addiction and the root of OCD may (again *sometimes* stem from the same thing.

If you define the root-cause of lust addiction as ultimately due to not really (i.e. subconsiously) believing that Hashem will take care of us (relationships, love, enjoyment in this world, etc) and/or feeling that the world is basically against us - and due to that feeling -> taking things into your own hands (pardon the pun) and self-medicating (whether your 'fix' is booze, drugs, p & m, food, video games, just wasting time, or whatever else fills the gap) --- then it can be argued that OCD may (in some cases) be another response to that inner rift.

In my case anyways, I believe that I started getting mild OCD symptoms around the same time that I would say a lust-addiction started, and it was a time in my life (just before bar-mitzva) where I have very painful emotional memories from. I'm not getting on the couch here or anything - just saying that perhaps (at least in some cases) the root treatment for OCD and Lust Addiction is the same thing - which is to re-accept Hashem as ultimately running the show and doing what's best for us. I certainly haven't done this (i.e. re-accept Hashem) yet - and I am realizing that it will take a ton of work to do so

I hope that doesn't sound preachy - and I'm just sharing my thoughts. You're much much farther along than I am... I haven't even started 12-steps, and am far from dispensing advice! But your OCD vs Lust-Addiction thoughts really caught my attention, and I wanted to chime in a bit.

the fourth group are the OCDs. I consider myself a member of this group. An interesting way of looking at the GYE universe. Lemme think about it. But let me add one small thing while I'm thinking -- not everyone that is straight is a sex addict.

And now I've thought about it... there might be yet another category. Guys who might not have an addiction they "can't" stop but rather a long-term habituation that makes it difficult for them to WANT to stop. And a place like this can help break the cycle, even without the hard-core tools for the hard-core addicts who might think they can "stop anytime they want" but in reality... can't. Just a thought.

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
